The Stanzaic Morte Arthur remains a marginal work in the study of medieval Arthurian literature, steeped in a strong tradition of critiquing its aesthetic value by noting its condensed and confusing narrative. In this presentation, however, Justin Brock will argue that through the complex interweaving of narratives and juxtaposition of various characters, the Stanzaic Morte presents a critique of the homosocial and masculine Arthurian court as an aggressive mess of kinship ties and chivalric expectations. At the center of this discussion is Lancelot, whose shifting alliance between the Arthurian court and women outside the court becomes the main drive of this critique.
