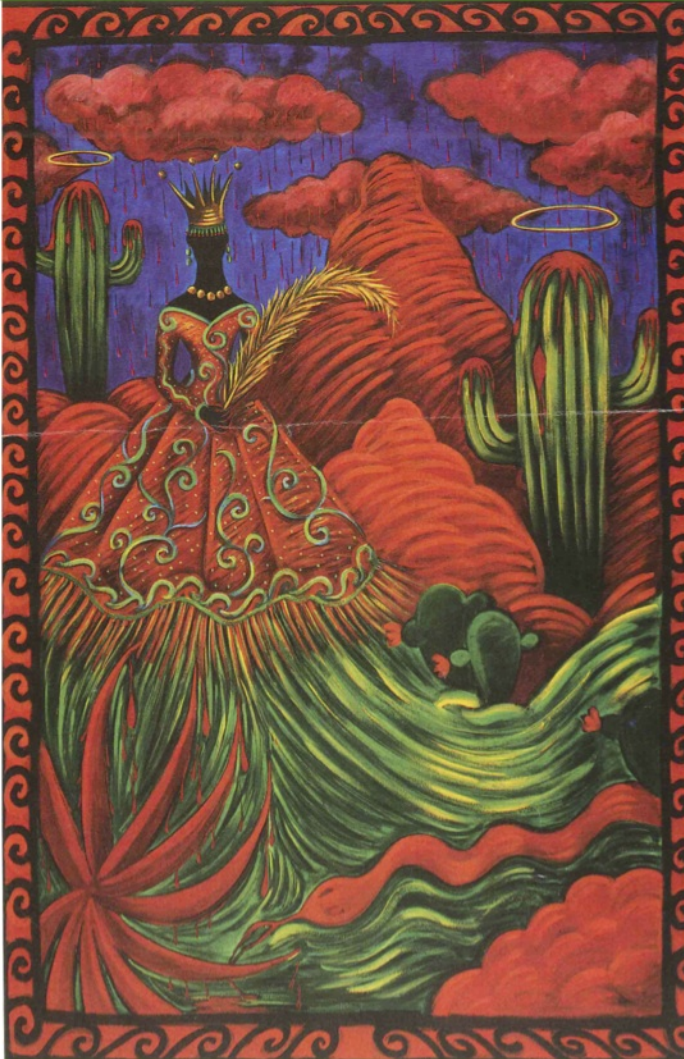

**THIS LECTURE INTRODUCES TWO SOUTHWEST WOMEN WRITERS WHO NEVER CROSSED PATHS IN THEIR OWN TIME, EVEN THOUGH THEY WERE CONTEMPORARIES. JOVITA GONZÁLEZ STUDIED ETHNOGRAPHY AND WROTE FICTION IN THE EARLY 1920s AND 1930s IN SOUTH TEXAS, AND ALICE CORBIN HENDERSON WAS A WELL-CONNECTED POET WHO RELOCATED TO SANTA FE AND BECAME A KEY PLAYER IN THE WRITER’S COLONY. THANKS TO THE GENEROUS SUPPORT OF A SUMMER RESEARCH GRANT FROM THE FRI, THIS LECTURE BRINGS TOGETHER THE ARCHIVES OF THESE TWO SOUTHWEST WOMEN WRITERS, BOTH LOCATED AT UT AUSTIN IN THEIR RESPECTIVE RESTING PLACES, GONZÁLEZ AT THE NETTIE LEE BENSON LATIN AMERICAN COLLECTION AND CORBIN HENDERSON AT THE HARRY S. RANSOM CENTER. THE LECTURE INTRODUCES THE TWO WOMEN WRITERS THROUGH THEIR ARCHIVES AND FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF REGIONAL LITERARY AND CULTURAL HISTORY.**
